
As you are aware, our office represents the Township of Lyndhurst Police Department and various officers named together with the EMS of the Township of Lyndhurst. I write to the Court for guidance based upon the fact that I am uncertain as to how to address this latest salvo by Mr. Kenworthy. Specifically, we have previously filed a Motion to Dismissal the original Complaint filed by Mr. Kenworth which he initially asked for additional time for the purposes of obtaining counsel. The Court provided him with the opportunity to respond to the Motion passed the original return date presumably to allow him to do one of two things, get an attorney on his own or file Opposition to the Motion to Dismiss.
