Atrial fibrillation could cause a stroke in that blood can become stagnant in the heart and cause clotting that gets to the brain, but unless he's been experiencing irregular heartbeats for a while, it isn't likely. I'm no doctor either but what we saw last night was almost certainly a TIA. Probably originating in the carotid artery. An ultrasound can determine whether or not there is a blockage. If there is, now is the time to treat it which could be as simple as taking blood thinners. That or surgery depending on the severity. I would suggest showing the video of the episode to the doctor and let them decide where to go from there.
